Readings: Year C

Dear Parishioners

This weekend we have the great excitement of a guest preacher, the priest who is leading the parishes' Mission in July, Fr Royston Price. He is a Redemptorist, the Order founded by that great saint Alphonsus Ligouri, prolific spiritual writer, bishop, Prince of Moral Theologians, Doctor of the Church and Patron of Confessors. St Alphonsus is said never to have refused absolution to a penitent and he spent his life combatting the heresy of Jansenism which preached an over-rigorous and harsh view of the Catholic Faith. Fr Royston is coming to both parishes. He will preach at all three weekend Masses and celebrate at St Teresa's at 9.15 am Sunday.

In July (12th-18th) he will be joined by another Missioner from the Mill Hill Mission, well known to many. Please try to keep that week free of evening commitments if possible. See the poster up at the back of church or in the newsletters.

Our Gospel for this weekend, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is the beautiful story of The Prodigal Son. Why did the father give away so much to the younger son, why was the older son so resentful...so many nuggets of spiritual gold to mine in this parable. What does it tell us about our recent theme, the Nature of God? It will be wonderful for us all to listen to Fr Royston as he unpacks this text.

This last week we celebrated the Solemnity of The Annunciation and it was very encouraging to see so many of the faithful at Mass. Stations of the Cross too have been well supported.

It is now only a fortnight to Palm Sunday and the beginning of that great liturgical drama: Holy Week. It is not too late to practice those traditional Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The Lord does not expect perfection from us. He knows how weak and fickle we can be. Let us respond to His great love for us seen in the Passion of Jesus, with our love for Him who carried that Cross for our salvation. Make Holy Week this year special, walk the Royal Way with the Saviour.
